

CROCHET GRASS



crochet grass

FOR THE CROCHET GRASS

What do you need:

- *medium* yarn (at a recommended hook size of 4-6 mm) in green colour
- I worked with a hook of size 5.00 mm
- Scissors
- A darning needle

Skill level: easy

Finished length of the piece: appr. 32 – 35 cm

Abbreviations:

sc = single crochet / *LS* = loop stitch / *inc* = increase / *dec* = decrease / *st*, *sts* = stitch, stitches / *sl st* = slip stitch / *ch* = chain

You crochet in **rows**. At each row end, ch 1 and turn your work. Then, skip this turning ch 1 and start working in the next st thereafter.












The number in the brackets at each row end indicate the new number of sts (excl. turning ch 1).

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How to make a loop stitch:

<p>Step 1: Stitch into the next st of your e.g. foundation ch.</p> 	<p>Step 2: Twist the yarn around your middle finger (first, move your middle finger from above the yarn down, then move it from below the yarn up, so that the yarn goes from under your middle finger up through your nail to your work). Then YO from above the yarn...</p> 
<p>Step 3: ... and pull up a loop (you have 2 loops on your hook).</p>  <p>You can now release your middle finger from the wrapped-around yarn. The loop st appears behind your work:</p> 	 
<p>Step 4: Now, yarn over again...</p> 	
<p>Step 5: ... and pull through the 2 loops on your hook to close into a sc st.</p> 	<p>Front-side of your work (after 4 loop sts):</p>  <p>Back-side of your work (after 4 loop sts):</p> 

INSTRUCTIONS

Ch 5 + turning ch 1.

- 1. Row:** 1 sc in each ch st across (5). Ch 1 and turn your work.
 - 2. Row:** 1 LS in each st across (5). Ch 1 and turn your work.
 - 3. Row:** 1 sc in each st across (5). Ch 1 and turn your work.
- Repeat 2. + 3. Row iteratively for another 24 times.

Fasten off and weave in yarn ends.

Repeat the above pattern but start with ch 10 (instead of ch 5) + turning ch 1.

At the end, you have 2 grass pieces that can be connected into one piece or be separately sewed to the blanket.
